



Christiane Rousseau is professor Emeritus at University of Montreal. Her research area is dynamical systems. She chaired her department in 1993-97 and she has been President of the Canadian Mathematical Society from 2002 to 2004. When she was Director of Centre de Recherches Mathématiques (CRM) in 2008-09, she initiated the international year “Mathematics of Planet Earth 2013” under the patronage of UNESCO. She served as Vice-president of the International Mathematical Union (IMU) for the period 2011-2014, and as member of the Executive Committee of IMU for 2015-2018. She led for IMU the proclamation by UNESCO of March 14 as the International Day of Mathematics (IDM), and she is now chairing the IDM international governing board. She served on the

Scientific Board of the International Basic Science Program of UNESCO for 2015-2020. During her whole career, she carried out in parallel research activities and outreach activities: lectures in schools and colleges, organization of mathematical camps, and articles in mathematical magazines. She was the inaugural recipient of the Bertrand Russell Prize of the American Mathematical Society in 2018, and she is a Fellow of the American Mathematical Society and of the Canadian Mathematical Society.
